## Guidelines for Student Research Relative to Hippotherapy

The American Hippotherapy Association, Inc. (AHA, Inc.) recommends students complete the following steps prior to engaging in research projects investigating hippotherapy as a treatment strategy.

- Review the AHA, Inc. website
  - Look over the general information explaining hippotherapy, and have an understanding of treatment principles relative to their specific discipline: <a href="https://www.americanhippotherapyassociation.org/">https://www.americanhippotherapyassociation.org/</a>
- Learn the correct terminology

- Complete a literature review
  - Review the bibliography of papers published on hippotherapy to see what research projects have already been completed:

- Find a mentor
